If you're heading out of town during the holiday season, remember to set your home to vacation mode. You can save energy while you're away by lowering your thermostat a few degrees or creating an "away" schedule with a smart or programmable thermostat. Newer water heaters include a vacation mode setting to help you save on water heating costs, or you can simply lower the temperature manually.

Small actions can also stack up to energy savings. Unplug devices that consume energy when they're not in use, including phone chargers, toothbrush chargers, TVs and gaming consoles.





INSPECT HEATING SYSTEM:

- Have your heating system professionally serviced.
- Replace air filters if needed.
- Ensure vents and radiators are unblocked for efficient heat distribution.

TEST AND MAINTAIN SMOKE AND **CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTORS:**

- Replace batteries in smoke and carbon monoxide detectors.
- Test detectors to ensure they function properly.

PREPARE PIPES AND WATER SUPPLY:

- Insulate exposed pipes to prevent freezing.
- Drain and shut off outdoor faucets and irrigation systems.
- Know the location of water shut-off valve in case of emergency.

PREPARE YOUR HOME'S EXTERIOR:

- Clear gutters and downspouts to prevent ice dams.
- Trim trees away from the house to avoid damage.
- Ensure downspouts extend away from the foundation.
- Service and store equipment such as lawnmowers and trimmers.
- Gather winter tools such as snow shovels and ice melt.

INCREASE HOME ENERGY EFFICIENCY:

- Seal gaps at windows and doors with weatherstripping or caulk.
- Set ceiling fans to rotate clockwise to circulate warm air.
- Lower your thermostat a few degrees to save on heating costs.

Play it safe when using portable generators

- Position generators at least 25 feet outside the home in a dry area, away from doors, windows and vents that can allow CO to enter the home. Never operate in a home or attached garage.
- Plug appliances directly into the generator using heavy-duty, outdoor-rated extension cords, but don't overload it. Follow manufacturer's instructions for maximum load.
- Keep children and pets away from portable generators at all times.
- Shut off the generator before refueling, or a fire could star — have a fully charged fire extinguisher nearby, just in case.



- Perform regular maintenance between uses.
- DO NOT plug a generator directly to a home outlet unless you have an appropriate transfer switch installed. If a generator is connected to a home's wiring

without a transfer switch, power can backfeed along power lines and electrocute utility lineworkers making repairs.

Have a permanent standby generator?

- We need to know! You or your installing contractor must submit the online Backup Generator Application at www.menard.com/ generators.
- Remember, any backup generation connected to your electric system must have an automatic transfer switch. Without the switch, the backup generation could feed back onto our lines, putting our linemen and others at risk of electrocution.

Budget Billing

Budget Billing averages the last 12 months of usage and determines a monthly budget amount. We bill that same amount each month for 11 months and on the 12th month settle up the account with a credit or additional balance due depending on actual electricity used for the year.
